JERTIH: Kes denggi negeri ini dilaporkan semakin serius, terutama di daerah Besut apabila merekodkan 43 pesakit dijangkiti wabak itu, membabitkan dua kes kematian sehingga Khamis lalu.

Pengerusi Jawatankuasa Kerajaan Tempatan, Perumahan, Kesihatan dan Alam Sekitar negeri, Dr Alias Razak, berkata kerajaan negeri bimbang dengan peningkatan wabak berkenaan dan tindakan segera perlu diambil bagi mengekang penularannya.

Beliau berkata, kes yang berlaku di Kampung Tok Saboh, Kuala Besut, itu menjadikan Besut daerah tertinggi merekodkan jumlah kes demam denggi, walaupun bilangan kes di seluruh negeri menurun kepada 102 kes tahun ini, berbanding 164 kes pada tahun lalu.

"Malah, lebih membimbangkan, kes denggi ini turut membabitkan 13 pelajar.

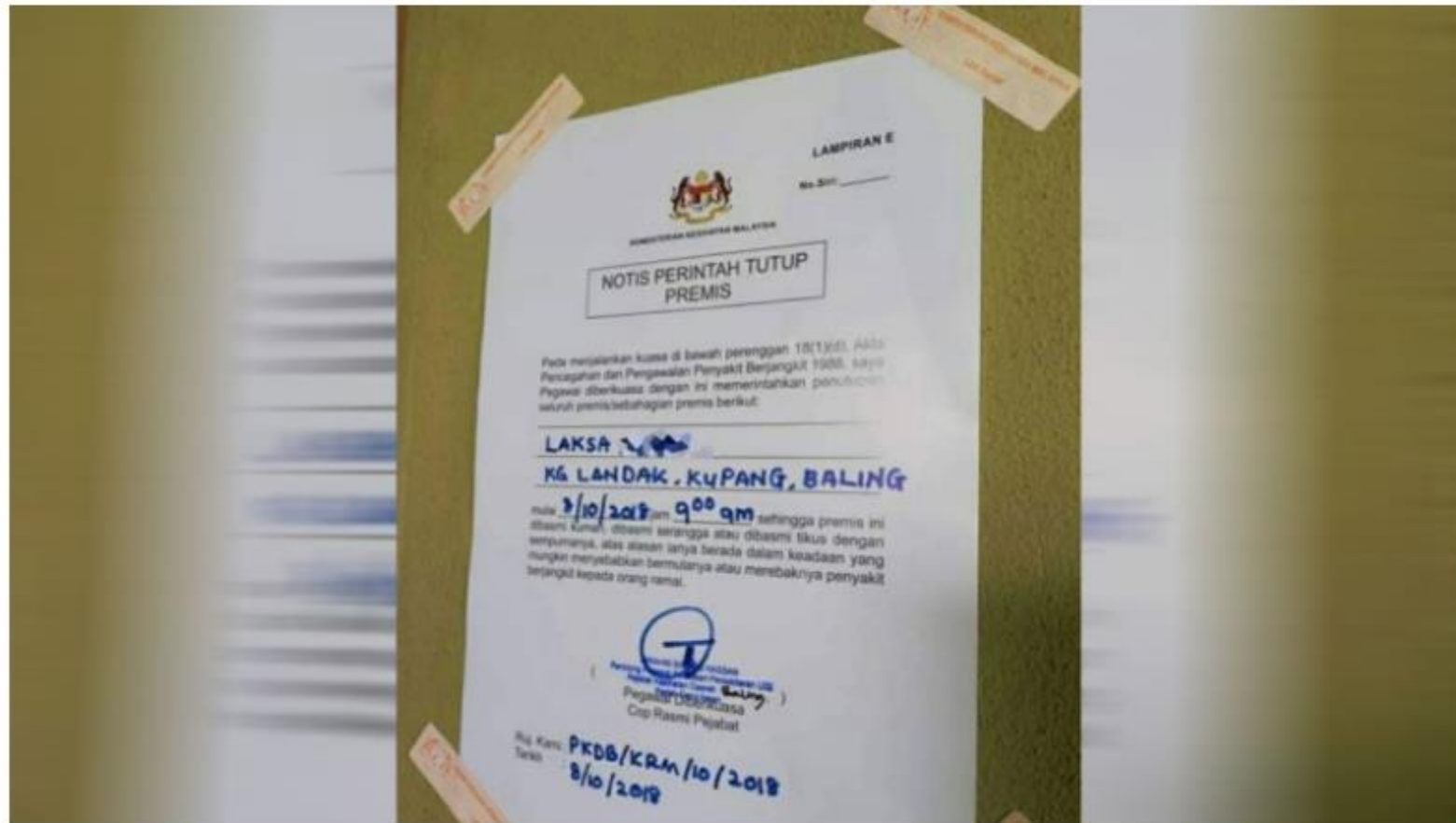

Sisa toksik: JAS dipersoal – Kilang di Melaka dikenal pasti punca bahan ammonia `bocor' di Johor

KUALA LUMPUR 11 Jan. - Jabatan Alam Sekitar (JAS) bakal menghadapi satu lagi `pukulan' apabila sisa toksik haram yang menghasilkan gas berbahaya ammonia sehingga memaksa 300 penduduk kampung di Labis, Johor berpindah kelmarin, berasal dari sebuah kilang di Melaka.

Persoalannya di sini ialah mengapa sisa toksik berbahaya itu terlalu mudah dibuang sesuka hati, sedangkan ia di bawah pengawasan JAS.

Utusan Malaysia diberitahu, JAS mempunyai satu sistem dikenali sebagai Sistem Penjejakan Sisa Berjadual (E-Swiss) yang akan memastikan sisa-sisa itu tiba ke destinasi `terakhir' di loji pelupusannya di Kualiti Alam Sdn. Bhd. di Bukit Nenas, Negeri Sembilan.

Sebaliknya sistem pengawasan itu gagal berfungsi baik sehingga menyebabkan sisa-sisa itu dibuang sesuka hati oleh pihak kilang atau kontraktornya.

(Sistem itu sepatutnya dikemas kini JAS melalui satu salinan borang konsimen yang diterimanya daripada pihak pekilang sebelum sisa toksik dihantar ke Kualiti Alam).

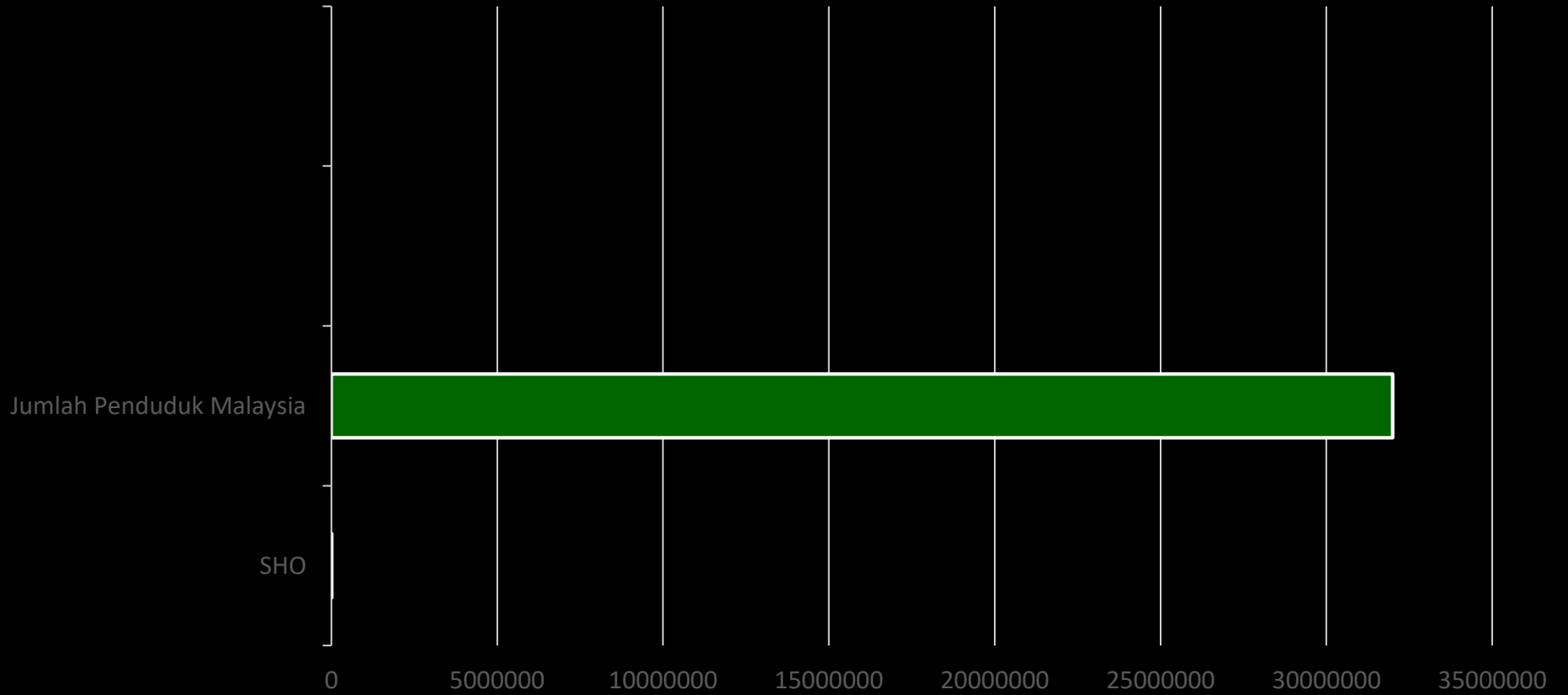

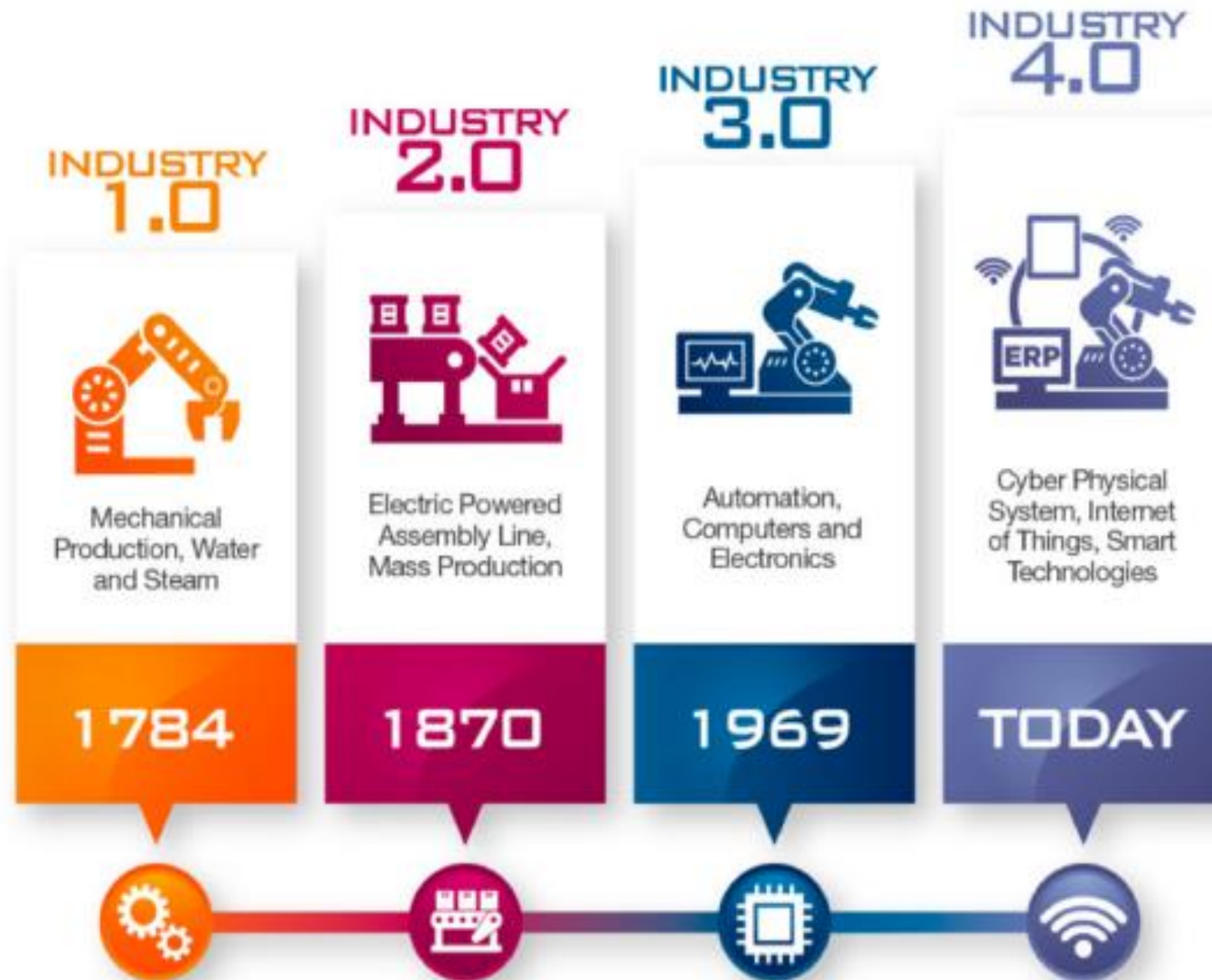
- The Malaysian Society for Industrial Safety was registered on the 27th April 1971.

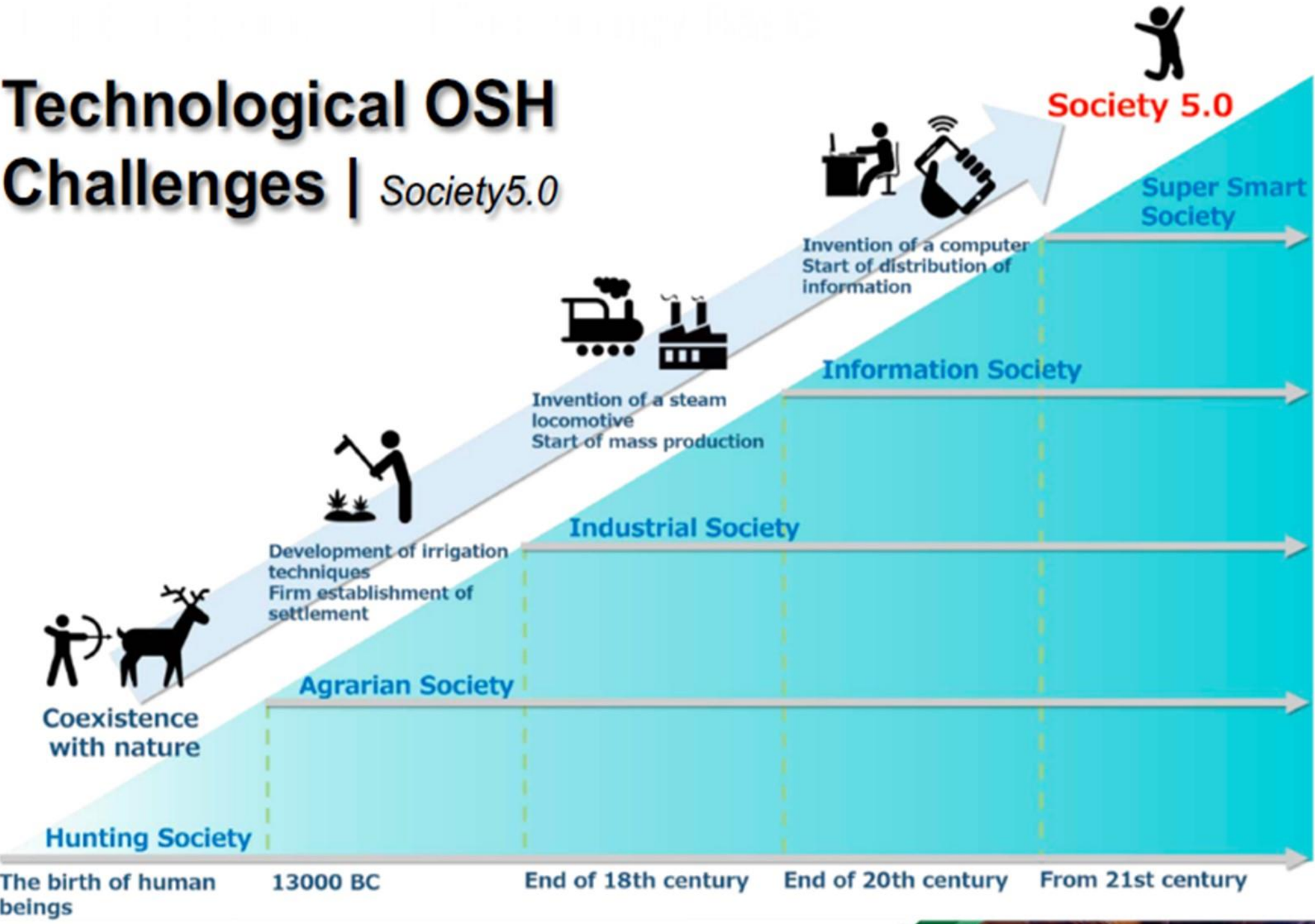

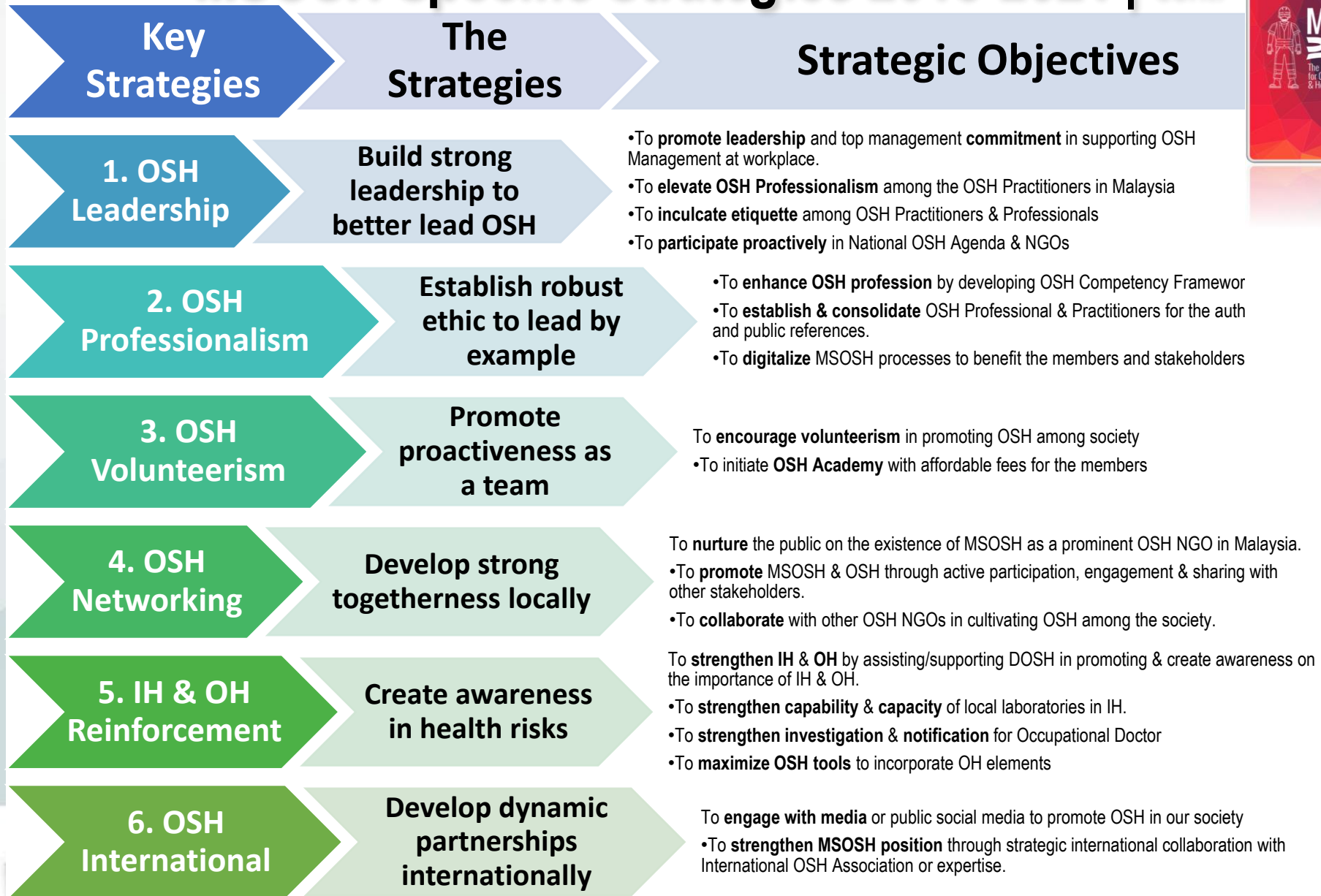
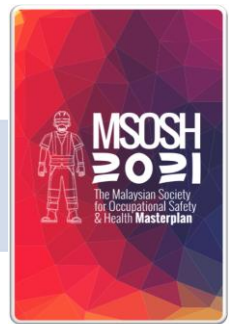
